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# Registration Conditions

This slideshow explains what happens when, after completing their investigation, the SSSC decides that a worker should be registered with a condition.

Conditions still allow workers to stay on the Register.

## When might a condition be imposed?

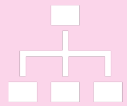
Conditions may be seen as being appropriate where:

You have shown insight

Receiving training or supervision would address the concerns

There are no perceived underlying issues with your values

# Effects of a Condition



You must take on the responsibility of meeting a condition.



The condition will be imposed for a specified time. It will permanently be a part of your record of registration with the SSSC.



Although your condition will not appear on the online register, it will be visible to your current and future employers.



## The offer letter

The draft Notice of Decision letter will inform you of the SSSC's decision to offer you a Registration Condition.

The notice will contain an explanation for this decision and what you will need to do to meet the condition.

You will also receive an 'acceptance form'. By returning this, you are accepting the condition. It is recommended that you seek legal advice before returning this form.

# Accepting a Condition

If you accept the condition, you will be sent a Notice of Decision.

Your registration with the SSSC will then be subject to that condition.

The SSSC may request that you provide evidence that you are meeting your condition. If you fail to meet your condition, you may be investigated further.

A copy of the Notice of Decision will also be sent to your employer.



# If you choose not to accept a condition

Inform your caseholder. They will arrange a Fitness to Practice Panel hearing.

If the Panel finds in the hearing that your fitness to practice is impaired, they will decide whether to impose a condition.

# Appealing a Decision



You may appeal to the Sheriff Court up to 14 days after you receive the Notice of Decision, even if you choose to accept it.

The decision will either come into force following the 14-day period or following the conclusion of an unsuccessful appeal.
